Introduction

The Right to Life Foundation, Haryana, faced significant challenges during the period from April 2021 to March 2022 due to the second wave of COVID-19. Impact of COVID-19

- Online and Telephonic Assistance: Provided support and assistance through online and telephonic channels within the foundation's network.
- Continuation of Research Work: Continued research activities online, gathering data and insights to inform future projects.
- Consultation with Medical Experts: Engaged with medical experts to seek advice and guidance on health-related matters and project planning.

By the end of the second wave of COVID-19, the foundation resumed follow-up activities with the Jhajjar administration. This involved:

- Application Follow-Up: Re-engaged with the new District Commissioner (D.C.) to follow up on the application submitted earlier.
- Site Visits: Conducted visits to various sites, including:
 - Brick Kilns: Assessed conditions and needs of workers in brick kilns.

- One Stop Centre: Evaluated the services and support provided at the one-stop
- Old Age Homes: Regularly visited old age homes to check on the well-being of residents and provide necessary support.

Routine Activities

Despite the challenges posed by the pandemic, the foundation maintained its routine activities, including:

- Visiting Brick Kilns: Continued visits to brick kiln sites to monitor conditions and offer support.
- One Stop Centre Visits: Regularly visited the one-stop center to ensure ongoing support for beneficiaries
- Old Age Home Visits: Maintained regular visits to old age homes, providing care and assistance to elderly residents.
